
Mangrove as habitat

Situated between the land and the sea, mangroves provide food and shelter for animals from both worlds.

While there are some permanent residents, the majority of animals are visitors, choosing certain times of day, tides or seasons or appearing at particular stages of their lifecycles, during migration, for breeding or at times of stress such as droughts.

It is a habitat of extremes, at one time flooded and then six hours later exposed to the sun.
